

PARENTS' INFORMATION ON THE PROCEDURE DURING OCCUPATIONAL THERAPY

Before the start of therapy please pick up the prescription for occupational therapy from the pediatrician, if necessary make an appointment beforehand - the prescription is valid for 28 days.

- In most cases, a prescription for therapy includes 10 therapy units.
- Make an appointment for an initial consultation in the practice.
- Please bring the valid prescription for remedies as well as current reports (e.g. school entrance examination, reports from other doctors) to the appointment.

First unit or parent interview

- This session serves to assess your child's everyday problems and resources. For this purpose, the therapist will have an initial conversation with you.
- It is helpful for the therapist to answer the question of why occupational therapy was prescribed.

From the 2nd therapy session

- Please bring your child to therapy on time.
- Please ensure that your child has a therapy folder (loose-leaf binder or similar).
- The therapy session lasts 30 minutes for a „motor-functional“ treatment, 45 minutes for a „sensorimotor-perceptive“ treatment and 60 minutes for a „mental- functional“ treatment.
- Please arrive at the practice 5 minutes before the end of the therapy so that a brief exchange with the child and the therapist is possible.
- After the 8th or 9th session, the treating therapist will prepare a therapy report for the doctor. You will also receive a copy for your records.
- If you need a new prescription, you must contact your pediatrician again. You should bring the new prescription with you to your next appointment.
